

Dace

Leuciscus leuciscus

Fish · Here all year · spawns Mar-May



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A slender, streamlined silver fish with a small head, a yellowish iris and — the useful identifying feature — dorsal and anal fins with a concave, hollowed-out edge, where the chub's are convex. Dace favour clean, fast, well-oxygenated flowing water, and shoal in the runs and glides of rivers rather than in still water.

BEHAVIOUR

Dace shoal in open, flowing water and feed on drifting insects, taking them from the surface as well as from the bed — they rise freely to a hatch, which makes them a familiar sight to fly anglers. They spawn early in the year over gravel shallows, before most other coarse fish. Their preference for clean, fast water means they are a reasonable indicator of river condition.
